FROM THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Greetings, Friends.

"And he(Abram) believed in the LORD; and He(the LORD) counted it to him for righteousness." (Genesis 15:6) What a powerful testimony that is to the faith of this man, Abram (later Abraham)! As we read about the life and experiences of this man, we discover that his journey through life was anything but a cakewalk. Abraham, you see, had been promised by God that, if he left his home and familiar surroundings back in Ur, then God would bless his with a great land and a great posterity. God in fact promised Abraham that he would become "the father of many nations," and that through him would "all families of the earth be blessed."

Surely as the years went by, Abram must have wondered if God was actually going to fulfill His promises. As Abraham and his wife Sarah watched themselves getting older and older, as it looked like the head-servant Eliezar was going to be the one to in fact inherit the possessions, God's promises of a son must have seemed more and more impossible to fulfill. 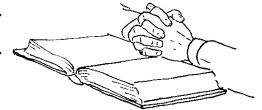


DEPRESSION RECOVERY SEMINAR

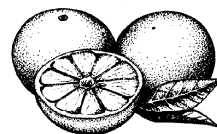
