FROM THE PASTOR'S CORNER

I love to read biographies. Biographies tell me about people – generally famous – who have accomplished great things in the face of adversity. Right now I'm reading a life story of George Washington beautifully written by James Flexner. It's called *Washington: The Indispensable Man*. Intriguing title: Is any one man today or throughout the course of history really indispensable? Was Washington? Was Lincoln? I suppose a case can be made that somehow, through divine Providence, there has always been just the right man – or woman – in the right place during a time of crisis. Author James Flexner presents George Washington as the "indispensable man" during the time of the American Revolution. That suggests that, had it not been for Washington's leadership, the colonies could well have lost their bid for independence, and we might be British citizens today.

I'm interested to hear what Washington had to say on the matter. After the battle of Monmouth, in which the colonial armies stood up to the British regular army, George Washington made this comment:

"The hand of Providence has been so conspicuous in all this that he must be worse than an infidel that lacks faith, and more than wicked that has not

gratitude enough to acknowledge his obligations – but it will be time enough for me to turn preacher when my present appointment ceases, and therefore I shall add no more on the Doctrine of Providence." (Washington: *The Indispensable Man*, James Flexner, p.125)

George Washington, like many another of our Founding Fathers recognized the "hand of Providence" – i.e. God – in the winning of the American Revolution. His faith, I believe, was the source of his dogged determination to keep going forward even when it seemed that the cause to which he gave so much to seemed hopeless.

Was he truly indispensable? It seems to me that the only truly indispensable Man was none other than the Lord Jesus Christ Himself. You see, God can qualify any man or woman to accomplish His purpose in whatever circumstance they may be in. But there was One and only One Who could cross the vast distance between heaven and earth, become a Man among us, at the same time be GOD WITH US, and receive upon Himself the penalty in full for the rebellion of a lost planet. Only one Man can put one hand upon the throne of heaven and the other upon fallen humanity, reconciling a sinful world to



a holy God. That one Man – Jesus Christ – I submit to you is the only "indispensable Man" who ever lived. Washington was great, but only as he recognized the hand of Providence in his life. Lincoln too was great; He too learned to depend increasingly upon the hand of God to sustain him during the crisis of the Civil War. History is replete with the stories of men and women – sometimes even children – who, by their

faith in God were able to accomplish great and noble things.

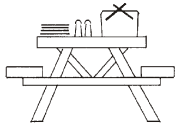
Are we, like Washington, believers in the "hand of Providence"? May God help us to strive for great things, to attempt the impossible, to believe that "all things are possible to him who believes."

DISTRICT PICNIC

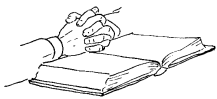
